A deputation from the St. James Parish
Council attended with regard to the Board

discussion it was proposed by Mr Neaverson
and seconded by Mr Wright, ^{seconded} that referring
to the resolution of the 28th October last
the Board would consent to apply £25
out of the £40 therein mentioned towards
the repair of the Low Locks subject to the
St. James Parish Council handing
over the management of the Locks to
the Surveyor of the Board and subject to
an arrangement being made as to the
height at which the water should be
kept at ordinary times.

New Ballast Pit at Colham

Dear Sir

You will remember that under an Agreement with your Board dated May 29th 1897 we pump water out of our Ballast Pit near Colham bridges into your South Drain. As the existing pit is now nearly worked out we propose to open a new pit about half a mile further north and the most convenient Channel for the water which we shall have to pump from there appears to be along the course taken by flood water, through the opening under the road next the railway and across the field into your North Drain. If convenient to you I shall be glad to meet you any day next week on the ground to point out our proposals and obtain your approvals.

ordered that the Clerks write to the Engineer and point out that serious questions arise on the Company's proposals especially banking round the new ballast pit which will have a tendency to divert flood water from its proper channel and ask what the Company are prepared to offer in the way of safe guarding the Board's interests and suggest an interview on the spot between the Engineer and the Board

The Chairman reported that he with the
Clerk & several members of the Board
met the assistant engineer of the District
Engineer of the G. N. Ry Co at Lolkham
Bridges on the 21st November last
and inspected the works of the Company
and received an explanation of
what was intended to be done.

It was ordered that, without prejudice
to any legal question which might
arise the Company in the future, the
Company be allowed to pump the
water from the new ballast pit
into the North Drain under an
agreement similar to the tubbets
existing agreement in regard to the
old ballast pit provided that the Company
brighten & make good the banks
