District of Drainage held at the Clerk's Office, Quexgate,  
Doverorough on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> May 1933.

The minutes of the last meeting were read  
and signed

The Clerk reported that as a result of correspondence  
he had had with the Ministry of Agriculture it  
appeared very doubtful whether the practice of the  
Board in laying a differential rate on the District  
known as the North Ten District was legal without  
adopting the procedure laid down in Section 74  
of the Land Drainage Act 1930 and after considerable  
discussion it was proposed by Mr. Stevenson seconded  
by Mr. Broome and carried that the Clerk be  
instructed at once to apply to the Wetland Catchment  
Board for their concurrence in the division of that  
area hitherto known as the North Ten consisting of  
450 acres more or less into a sub district for the  
purpose of differential rating.

It was proposed by Mr. Hadman seconded by  
Mr. Stevenson and carried that no proceedings be  
taken at present to collect the arrears of the rates  
due for the North Ten and General District

respectively on 17<sup>th</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 1932 and it was decided that as soon as the requisite order under the foregoing resolution had been obtained and confirmed a meeting be called to lay fresh rates.

The Clerk then pointed out that he had caused the rated area to be very carefully investigated and checked and in consequence it appeared that 55:1:16 within the area consisted of Drainage Banks 11.2.28 of which belonged to the Newborough Drainage Board and the remainder to this Board and it was proposed by Mr Fitzwilliam seconded by Mr Broome & carried <sup>Mr Strange dissenting</sup> that the Clerk be instructed to apply at once to the Welland Catchment Board for their concurrence in the exemption of that part of the Board's District containing 58:1:16 and consisting entirely of Drainage Banks of which 11.2.28 belong to the Newborough Drainage Board and the remainder to this Board, wholly from rating on the ground that these banks belong to the Drainage Authorities concerned and should not be subject to drainage rates.

It was decided that should the necessary consents be obtained the orders made under these Sections should be published in the Peterborough Advertiser.

The Surveyor reported the work done at Lolham South Bank and Crofton Bank and was authorised to buy 25. 12 ft poles 3" x 9" from Mess<sup>r</sup> Wimpey & Co the Folly Bridge Contractors for £9.7.6 and two wheel barrows and three wheelbarrows for the use of the Board.

The Clerk read correspondence he has had with the Ministry of Agriculture and explained what they required with reference to the procedure to be adopted for the differential rating of the North Sea area and finally it was proposed by Mr Vergette seconded by Mr Hadman and carried Mr Strange dissenting that the following order be made.

(1) That the lands and hereditaments in the Drainage District be divided into two sub districts as follows

(a) the area consisting of 452:2:10 formerly known as the North Sea situate in the Parish of Deeping Gate and Northborough in the County of Northampton and shewn in red colour on the Map sealed in relation to this order

(b) the residue of the Board's District

It was also proposed by Mr Vergette seconded by Mr Neaverson and carried Mr Strange dissenting

(2) that the proportion which the amount per pound of annual value to be absorbed upon the occupiers of hereditaments in the North Sea District shall bear to the

amount to be apportioned on the occupiers  
of the residue of the Board's District shall  
be the proportion of five to two.


Consequent on these proposals the Clerk was  
instructed to advertise the Orders and submit them  
to the Ministry of Agriculture for confirmation.

It was reported that owing to the impossibility  
of the collection of the rates the Board's Banking ac  
was nearly up to the full amount of the overdraft  
and that it was estimated that a further £300 would  
be required.

It was proposed by Mr Vergeote seconded by  
Mr Hadman and carried Mr Strange dissenting  
that the Chairman and Clerk be authorized to  
make arrangements with Barclays Bank Ltd for an  
overdraft on the Board's ac for a sum not exceeding  
£700 until 31<sup>st</sup> Mar 1934.

and it was reported that the master had received

Mr Strange read some correspondence he had

the Board's area and the question of having an  
Ordnance Map of the whole District prepared was  
discussed but it was decided not to go further


