A letter from the Clerks to the Witham District
Drainage Board, as to application for Government
Grant towards Drainage expenses was read and
it was proposed by Mr Lampton seconded by Mr Broome
& carried that same be left on the table.

An application by R Perkins for an increase of
wages was discussed and it was proposed by Mr
Nevenson seconded by Mr Fitzwilliam and carried
that the rate of pay for both men when employed
at the pumping station be 1/2 per hour for night
work from 6 pm to 6 am and on Sundays
and 1/4 per hour for day work otherwise.

On the proposition of Mr Broome seconded by
Mr Fitzwilliam the seal of the Board was affixed
to the Agreement for the Extinguishment of Manorial
Incidents affecting the Board's piece of land at Deakirk
formerly held of the Manor of Glington with Deakirk.

Correspondence with the Exchange Insurance Co. as to damage to Bainton Brook Bridge caused by one of their insured persons and in which they offered to pay one half of the cost of repairs was read and it was decided to enforce the full amount.

An agreement with the Loke of Peterborough County Council as to taking over the Ginton and Bainton Brook Bridges was agreed subject to a suggested alteration.

Major Sterling attended and explained the position as to the Bainton Brook Bridge which was satisfactory and the Ginton Bridge also.

A letter from the Exchange Insurance Company as to claim for damage to Bainton Brook Bridge was read and it was left to the Clerk to settle as best he could.

Mr Neaverson proposed a scheme for damming the private drain in the Horse Ground and fixing a tidal valve at the outlet and constructing a barrier bank and drain from that point across Milton Estate Land to the North Drain. It was decided that this could not be proceeded with.

Mr Neaverson then proposed an alternative scheme for reconstructing the bank from the North Drain across land belonging to the Messrs Neaverson and constructing a dam across the private drain in the Horse Ground belonging to the Rector of Deakirk with a tidal flap as an outlet the banks of the existing private drain to be raised up to 8 feet 6 inches. It was decided to.

concerned to meet the Works Committee on the spot to discuss the matter and the Works Committee then to report.

Mr. J. Dridmore raised the question of the Board taking over a pipe drain in land in his occupation in Northborough North Fen but it was decided that nothing could be done.

It was proposed by Mr. Sampson seconded by Mr. Neaverson & carried that notice of the rate be advertised one insertion in the Peterborough Standard and the Peterborough Advertiser.

The report of the sub-committee on Mr. W. Neaverson's scheme was read.

Mr. Sampson proposed that the Newborough Commissioners be asked to block up the sluice at the outlet of Paynes Holme Drain into the Tolly. Mr. Hadman seconded and the proposition was carried.

Mr. Bate reported that the cost of a dam across the private drain in the Horse Ground would be £18. 10. 0

It was proposed by Mr. Neaverson seconded by Mr. Goodfellow and carried that a dam be placed across the private drain in the Horse Ground at the outlet into the Paynes Holme Drain and that a 24 inch tidal flap be fixed in the dam and the banks of the drain be raised where necessary.

The correspondence with the L & N E Rly. was read and Mr. Sampson said that if the Maxey Drainage Board liked to put a tidal flap in the Newborough Drainage Board's sluice near Deakirk Station Crossing and be responsible for its upkeep the Newborough Commissioners would agree, and it was proposed by Mr. Broome seconded by Mr. Neaverson and carried that this offer should be accepted.
