Market Deeping

The Parish Council of the Parish of Deeping St James.
Dear Sir
Rusi Welland

Mr Williams your surveyor asks that this Council
will ratify the provisional agreement made on the 19th
last on behalf of your Masey Drainage Board and your this
Council.

The terms suggested were that your Board shall repair
the Low Lock Door and clean out the South half of the River
and that this Council shall repair the Stone Weir and clean
out the Northern part of the River

That the work shall extend over a series of years and that
each party shall expend the sum of forty pounds per annum.

We presume that the present representatives of either party
can hardly find their successors and that in the event of
the failure of one party to perform the work the other party
would be discharged from any obligation.

It was ordered that the Clerks be 31
instructed to reply that the Surveyor of
the Board be allowed to expend up to £40
within the ensuing 12 months in removing
shoals in the South side of the River
Welland between the outfall sluice
and the High Locks. Provided that the
Parish Council proceed with ^{the} necessary
corresponding work upon the North side
of the river expending thereon an
equal amount.
